"One of the interesting phases of a Chaplain's work in the war was the Padre's Hour when for one of the regular training hours each week he had the men for discussion of fundamental life questions. There the meaning of life often came up for discussion and often the question was seriously raised whether anything was really worthwhile, whether any standards and values were really important in the long run. Possibly the question was partially the expression of a general weakening of moral fibre over the past few decades, sometimes possibly it was the disillusionment of the war, sometimes it was to provoke the Padre but more often the question was in earnest."

George Lyman Anglin (Fairville, NB) - 21st Division, C.E.F. Killed in action at Vimy Ridge April 9, 1917. Age 21. No known grave.

Robert McLaren Armstrong (Moncton, NB) Royal New Brunswick Regiment. Died November 6, 1917. Age 24. No known grave.

Highland Winfield Borden (Avonport, NS) Nova Scotia Regiment. Died April 9, 1917. Age 21. No known grave.

Robert Melbourne Brown (Montreal, QC). Canadian Infantry. Died June 2, 1916. Age 19. No known grave.

Rupert Wilfred Bartlett (Brigus, NL). Royal Newfoundland Regiment. Died November 30, 1917. Age 26. Buried at Beaumont Hamel, France. Awarded Military Cross, Cavalier of the Order of the Crown (Italy).

Gordon Valentine Boone (St. John's, NL) Canadian Field Artillery. Died April 27, 1915. Age 30. Buried at Hagle Dump Cemetery, Belgium.

Frederic Charles Burchell (Windsor, NS) Canadian Expeditionary Force. Died December 27, 1916. Age 23. Buried at Maroeuil British Cemetery, France.

Albert DesBrisay Carter (Point de Butte, NB) Royal Air Force / Canadian Air Force. Died May 22, 1919. Age 26. Buried at Old Shoreham Cemetery, Sussex, England. Ace pilot, awarded the Distinguished Service Order and Bar, Military Cross, Distinguished Flying Cross, and the Croix de Guerre of Belgium.

Joseph Leonard Clark (St. George, NB) Quebec Regiment. Died September 18, 1916. Age 27. No known grave.

Bert Frederick Cooper (Leicester, England) Canadian Garrison Regiment. Died November 4, 1918. Age 31. Buried at Fort Massey Cemetery, Halifax.

Alexander Fraser Craig (Truro, NS) Nova Scotia Regiment. Died September 16, 1916. Age 24. No known grave.

Harold Carleton Davis (Oxford, NS) Royal Air Force. Died December 5, 1918. Age 25. Buried at Doncaster Old Cemetery, Yorkshire, United Kingdom.

William Earl Davison (Indian River, PEI) Canadian Garrison Artillery. Died October 5, 1918. Age 21. Buried at Etaples Military Cemetery, France.

Mark Lorne DeLong (New Germany, NS) Central Ontario Regiment. Died April 9, 1917. Buried at Givenchy Road Canadian Cemetery, France.

Eric Reginald Dennis (Halifax, NS) Canadian Infantry. Died April 5, 1917. Age 21. Buried at Ecoivres Military Cemetery, France. Awarded Military Cross.

Clifford Drummond (Newcastle, NB) Canadian Mounted Rifles. Died October 28, 1920. Age 24. Buried at Maple Glen Cemetery, NB.

Charles Hedley Edgecombe (Fredericton, NB) Royal Air Force. Died October 6, 1918. Age 30. Buried at Salisbury (London Road) Cemetery, UK

St. Clair Preston Elderkin (Port Greville, NS) Canadian Infantry. Died April 14, 1917. Age 21. Buried at Brookwood Military Cemetery, UK.

Vernon Cleveland Elderkin (Parrsboro, NS) Canadian Infantry. Died May 21, 1915. Age 27. No known grave.

Philip Levi Findley (Sambro, NS) Canadian Army Medical Corps. Died November 29, 1918. Age 37. Buried at Etaples Military Cemetery, France.

George Gear (St. John's, NF) Royal Newfoundland Regiment. Died November 30, 1917. Age 27. Buried at Rocquigny and Equancourt British Cemetery, France.

John Lockhart Godwin (Ottawa, ON) Canadian Field Artillery. Died July 8, 1916. Age 26. Buried at Reninghelst New Military Cemetery, Belgium.

Colin Crawford Gray (Yarmouth, NS) Died September 1916

William Fraser Hale (Dartmouth, NS) Canadian Army Medical Corps. Died June 8, 1918. Age 40. Buried at Aubigny Communal Cemetery (Extension), France.

John Manuel Hensley (Summerside, PEI) Canadian Infantry. Died October 30, 1917. Age 18. Buried at Tyne Cot Cemetery, Belgium.

Frank Major Hughes (Charlottetown, PEI) Canadian Field Artillery. Died September 28, 1918. Age 23. Buried at Queant Communal Cemetery Extension, France.

James Coleman Jordan (Saint John, NB) Canadian Infantry. Died August 28, 1918. Age 23. No known grave.

John Earle Lockerby (Hamilton, PEI) Canadian Infantry. Died September 16, 1916. Age 25. No known grave.

Terence Cochran Lockwood (Lockeport, NS) Canadian Engineers. Died January 10, 1919. Age 19. Buried at Etaples Military Cemetery, France.

Erskine Lindsay (Gaspe, QC) Canadian Infantry. Died November 6, 1916. Age 24. Buried at Adanac Military Cemetery, France.

Ronald Sutherland Machum (Saint John, NB) Canadian Infantry. Died August 18, 1918. Age 26. Buried at Ligny-St. Flochel British Cemetery, France.

Rena MacLean (Souris, PEI) Canadian Army Medical Corps. Died June 27, 1918. Age 39. Killed when the Canadian hospital ship HMHS Llandovery Castle, on which she was serving as a nurse, was torpedoed by German U-Boat U-86, which then rammed the lifeboats and machine-gunned the survivors. The U-boat captain escaped punishment for the war crime.

George Tennyson Metherall (Fortune Cover, PEI) Canadian Infantry. Died June 7, 1918. Age 29. Buried at Bellacourt Military Cemetery, France.

David Gordon Mott (Dalhousie, NB) Royal Flying Corps. Died December 27, 1917. Age 18. Buried at Campbellton Rural Cemetery, NB.

Arthur John Motyer (Hamilton, Bermuda) Canadian Field Artillery. Died September 15, 1916. Age 30. Buried at Sunken Road Cemetery, France. Rhodes Scholar.

Donald Rice Munro (Amherst, NS) Royal Flying Corps. Died July 28, 1917. Age 24. Buried at Lincoln (Newport) Cemetery, UK.

Kenneth King MacKenzie (Sackville, NB).

Arthur Harold MacKay (Sydney, NS) Canadian Field Artillery. Died. August 14, 1915. Age 25. Buried at Longuenesse (St. Omer) Souvenir Cemetery, France.
